There will be no electricity.

No running water.

No bathrooms.

No wi-fi.

It's going to be a challenge, but members of Trinity's High School Youth are ready – for anything.

"Absolutely," shared Kyle Smith, who will be a senior at Davenport Central High School in the fall. "If I can survive a night at Motel 6 with terrible cell service, questionable bathrooms, and the possibility of bed bugs, I think I can handle anything." Kyle, who will be going on his first mission trip, will be joined by 19 other members of Trinity's High School Youth who will be serving off the grid in Colorado from July 20-26.

There also will be five adults attending, including Kari Smith, who is Trinity's High School Youth leader.

"I'm excited to be outside and seeing how pretty Colorado is in the summer," shared Jayde Jorgensen, who will be going on her second mission trip with Trinity's High School Youth. "I'm hoping there are no bear attacks, but I'm most excited to backpack and hike to the place where we will be staying."

Upon arrival at the Lutheran Valley Retreat in Woodland, Colorado, the group will hike five to seven miles and spend three days cleaning up trails.

During its stay, the group also will be doing zip-lining and whitewater rafting.

"Although missions trips involve work, it's a lot of fun, and I enjoy working with other people," shared Jayde Jorgensen, who graduated from Davenport North High School this spring.

The theme for the trip is SAME based on John 15:12. Jesus died on the cross for us, and He wants us to be a witness of His love because so many around us are broken and struggling.

"It will be an opportunity for the Youth to be in awe of God's glory," shared Kari Smith.
