"It's been busy, chaotic," shared LCMS missionary and deaconess Tirzah Krey during her visit to Trinity Lutheran this past week. "The craziness is good."

Tirzah stays busy providing care and advocating for the missionaries and their families in all aspects of their physical, spiritual and emotional health. She also coordinates community health and teaches health education.

"It's always busy," shared Tirzah. "It's a good thing."

The work continues – both near and far.

Sharing the Good News is world-wide.

"We have to keep spreading and expanding," said Tirzah, who shared a presentation after Wednesday's school chapel service and also spent time in classrooms, connecting with students and teachers during her visit to Trinity.

It's a process – and for Trinity Lutheran it's been a learning curve.

In the summer of 2023, members of Trinity traveled to the Dominican Republic to gain a better understanding of the process – how can we be a blessing, both in the DR and in our community.

Pastor Schilling, Mark Jorgensen and Carlos Roldan are in the Dominican, gathering even more information, and in March, members of our faculty will be traveling to the DR.
