# MUCH-NEEDED MAKEOVER

Trinity's gym floor has lost its traction.

Trinity's gym bleachers have gaps from being pushed in and out for the past 25-plus years.

Both are safety concerns.

"You have definitely got your money's worth out of your gym floor," a representative from Specialty Flooring out of Rockford, Ill., shared. "But it needs some attention."

This past week, Trinity's Board of Directors gave the go-ahead to proceed with gym renovations.

The gym floor, which will be sanded down to the original wood, repainted and re-sealed, and the installation of new bleachers are the top priorities for the project.

The installation of a sound system, along with cameras for livestreaming capabilities also will be part of the scope of work, which is scheduled to begin this summer.

Other gym wish fixes include: a new floor covering for the gym, a new scoreboard, replacing the closet doors, new side basketball hoops, replacing the wall mats under each main basket, the addition of recognition banners, along with adding our new branding to the walls, which were painted in the spring of 2024.

Increased traffic – a jump in enrollment and adding Catholic League games for volleyball and basketball – on Trinity's gym has pushed the needed repairs to the top of the priority list.

The gym renovations are another step forward—a path toward excellence and the safety of our students.
